St Mary's Church, located in Bideford has £475K funds of work to complete to continue to provide a service to our local community, conserve and remodel the church for current and future generations. In May 2017 the PCC held an open day at St Mary's inviting local dignitaries, businesses in Bideford, schools, colleges and a variety of organisations to seek their thoughts on improving the church and its functionality. By far the most pressing response was to improve access to the church for the elderly, wheelchair, pushchair/pram users for community activities such as Music Makers, Messy Church, Services, Friday Diner, Men's Breakfast We intend to do this by widening the entrance externally and internally, put in new glass doors, a ramp, hand rail and removing bottlenecks inside the church. A £1000 grant will help towards this.

This is just the warm up round, We will try again in June for the £50K award!

SAFEGUARDING

Some people in the congregation may have
had an email from me about safeguard-
ing. The diocese wants every church within its
boundaries to be vigilant about safeguarding,
both for the sake of workers and those who
come through our doors. To that end, they
have developed a 'Safer recruitment'
policy, which provides a safe structure for both
paid and voluntary workers within the
church. This ensures that everyone who is ful-
filling a role is checked and verified, but
also supported and cared for themselves.

At St Marys we are so grateful for the many
people who volunteer in many ways to keep
the church and its various groups and
activities running.

If you have begun volunteering in a role
within the past year, you will soon get an
application form from me, asking for the
names of 2 referees, who can vouch for your
suitability to do the job required. This is not
meant to be 'invading your privacy' in any
way, but simply to ensure everyone is safe and
cared for. I will send for references and then
we'll have a chat to make sure you are com-
pletely happy, and then you will be able to
begin to continue to volunteer in your
chosen way. If you would like to volunteer
with a particular group, then have a word with
the group leader first, and maybe go along and
observe, but please have a chat with me be-
fore beginning to volunteer on a regular
basis.

This is a huge culture change for the church,
but is the way society is leading and we must
not be seen to lag behind in putting the
welfare of others before our own. If you are
unsure about any of this and want to chat
further, please see me after the service.


